

Over 120 scheduled destinations connecting 35 countries around the world

The intercontinental segment has doubled (+56% vs 2024) thanks to flights to the United States and Canada.

To the connections with New York and Philadelphia, already operational last summer, Atlanta, Chicago, and Montreal are now being added.

Naples, April 10, 2025 – After completing the first quarter of 2025 with **2,099,000 passengers**, the Neapolitan airport reports an increase in intercontinental connections for summer 2025, which began on March 30. **More than 120 total destinations** are served with direct flights from Naples, covering major Italian cities and European capitals, with particular relevance for global connectivity guaranteed by **38 daily flights to 24 hubs** (Amsterdam, Athens, Atlanta, Belgrade, Brussels, Casablanca, Dubai, Chicago, Dublin, Frankfurt, Helsinki, Lisbon, London, Istanbul, Madrid, Montréal, Munich, New York EWR and JFK, Paris, Philadelphia, Rome, Vienna, Zurich). These strategic hubs allow access to any destination worldwide with just one transit. The summer schedule includes connections to 5 cities in North America and numerous popular tourist destinations such as the Balearic Islands (this summer up to 17 weekly departures to Ibiza) and extensive coverage of the Greek archipelago, with daily flights to 10 islands, including Mykonos, Santorini, Corfu, and Zante.

On the intercontinental traffic front, the flight to New York/Newark departed on April 6, with additional flights to North America being progressively added, reaching a total of 43 weekly frequencies across six airports: **Atlanta, Chicago, Montréal, New York/Newark, New York JFK, and Philadelphia**. These connections will be operated by the three major U.S. airlines - American Airlines, Delta Airlines, and United Airlines - and by Air Canada, the leader in the Canadian market. The growth has been exponential: in just two years, total capacity has more than quadrupled, with the number of seats increasing from 100,000 in 2023 to 425,000 in 2025. During summer 2025, international connection opportunities are intensifying, with the **United Kingdom** confirmed as the **top international market** with 8 connected cities, followed by Germany, France, and Spain.

"The wide range of destinations, with the presence of the three major U.S. airlines and the introduction of the first direct connection to Canada, represents an exceptional milestone for our airport, confirming its role as the main gateway of Southern Italy," said **Roberto Barbieri, CEO of GESAC**. "The continuous and strategic expansion of our network has facilitated the mobility of tourists, students, entrepreneurs, and goods, creating jobs, stimulating entrepreneurial initiatives, and fostering the exchange of ideas and knowledge. We are proud to represent a key element for the economic and social development of the region."
